
## Factor Lines Sudoku by Philip Newman

Rules: Standard Sudoku rules (insert a number from 1 to 9 into each cell so that no number repeats in any row, column, or bold region). For every pair of adjacent values connected by a line, one number is a multiple or a factor of the other. It is possible for a number to be adjacent to itself. (For example if R3C4 were 3, then R2C3 which is connected to R3C4 could be 1, 3, 6, or 9, because 1 is a factor of 3, 3 is a factor and multiple of itself, and 6 and 9 are multiples of 3.) The color of the lines in this puzzle is for artistic purposes only.
